# What's been happening at Morningside?

In Reception we have loved sharing books with each other in our cosy home corners.




Miss Sarah lead a maths carpet time singing our nursery rhyme of the week "5 little speckled frogs."

This term Year 1 are learning about Joan Miro. We took a line for a walk. We drew different types of lines and made sure to not take our pencil off the paper.









This week in 2S we planted cress seeds and have been observing them grow for our science topic 'Plants'. One pot was in the cupboard with no light, and the other pot was by the window getting lots of sunlight - can you tell which pot got the most sunlight?

During a Geography lesson the pupils in Year 3 were using their mapping skills to colour code a picture of the British Isles. They also produced a colour-coded key to represent the different regions.





# What's been happening at Morningside?

In science Year 4 have been learning about the key things plants need so they can grow. We're undertaking an experiment to see what happens if a plant doesn't get enough water. Which of these plants looks healthier?



Year 5 learnt all about friction today in science. We proved that you can lift a bottle of rice with just one chopstick. Try this experiment for yourself at home to see how friction can be stronger than gravity. Super science!

## **Physical Education**

Vision: Physical Education is taught across the school by specialist coaches from **BADU** Sports. Through the use of coaches, we hope children are able to increase their knowledge regarding the rules of sports, the importance of team work and how fitness affects the body. We also desire that children find enjoyment in sports and display good sportsmanship when faced with challenges.

#### Curriculum

Children across the school are taught net games i.e basketball, netball and football alongside dance, gymnastics and yoga. In the summer, they focus on fitness and athletics as well as games such as rounders and cricket.

The skill focus changes across the year groups to ensure progression as they go up the school.

### **Lunch times**

This year, there are different lunchtimes for each year group in order to facilitate social distancing and thorough cleaning of shared spaces. Children eat their lunch inside and then go outside to play.

### **Payments**

School lunches are £1.85 per day or £9.25 per week. Payments for school meals need to be made on Parent Pay. Please visit the school office if you require account details, or would like help setting up your account.



### **Universal Infant Free School Meals**

The government enables every child in reception, year 1 and year 2 in statefunded schools to receive a free school lunch. For more information on how this works please visit the gov.uk website.

### **Packed Lunches**

It is important for children to be given a healthy packed lunch each day. A balanced meal makes a child alert and ready to aim high with their learning. Please do come and talk to us if you would like some ideas about how to provide healthy meals for your child.

### Water

Water is available in the dining hall at lunchtimes and in the playground during playtime. We encourage children to drink freely at these times.

### **School Streets**

### Zone SS14 – Morningside Primary School – Chatham Place and Ram Place


- School Streets is the Council's pioneering scheme to transform roads outside schools, so that only pedestrians and cyclists can use them at school start and finish times.
- The streets tackle congestion and improve air quality at the school gates, making it easier and safer to walk and cycle to school.
- They create a more pleasant environment for everyone, while making sure residents, businesses, pedestrians and cyclists can still use the road.

#### How it works

The streets around a school temporarily become a pedestrian and cycle only zone at set times in the morning and afternoon. Vehicles are not permitted to enter the zone between these times unless they have been granted an exemption.

Signs inform drivers of the restrictions at the entrance(s) to the closed street(s). Vehicles are not allowed to enter the School Streets zone during the times of operation, unless they are registered for an exemption. School Streets will be spot enforced across the borough, and infractions can carry a penalty charge issued by a camera. For more information please visit hackney.gov.uk/school-streets

Your child must be registered to attend Play Centre. Please contact the reception to register your child(ren).




### **School Uniform**

### Safeguarding Children

Information regarding Safeguarding & Child Protection at Morningside Primary School and Children Centre

#### Our prime responsibility as a school is to ensure that all children are safe.

Safeguarding can be defined as:

"The process of protecting children from abuse or neglect, preventing impairment of their health and development and ensuring they are growing up in circumstances consistent with the provision of safe and effective care that enables children to have optimum life chances and enter adulthood successfully."

School plays an important role here. For Morningside Primary School it means that we have procedures for the following:

- Child Protection
- Behaviour
- E-Safety
- Visits
- Incident Management
- Risk Assessment
- Allegation of Abuse
- Child Absconding
- Information Sharing
- Medical Needs
- Supervision

It is important to avoid any coaching of a child during a disclosure. Any early discussion with the child should, as far as possible, adhere to the following basic principles:

- A. <u>Listen</u> to the child, rather than directly question him or her
- B. <u>Never</u> stop a child who is freely recalling significant events
- C. Make a note of the discussion, taking care to record the timing setting and personnel present as well as what was said

Report any concerns to a member of staff straight away – never delay to inform the relevant officer.



You should list more than one school (maximum 6). Listing only one school does not mean you will be offered a place.

The order is important. List your favourite school as the first preference, then your next favourite school as your second preference and so on. Listing a school as your first preference does not increase your chance of being offered a place.

Each school is given equal consideration regardless of where you list it in your preferences. The order of your preferences will only be considered if your child qualifies to be offered more than one place.



### Tips for parents








'Activities' tell you what your child is learning, 'Badges' tell you why the teacher has praised your child and 'Messages' keep you up to date. Think of them as conversation starters to everyday questions like: 'What did you learn at school today?' Were you good?' 'Have you got any messages?'



Use your new insight wisely and prompt conversations with your child at different times, such as when travelling, over dinner or at quiet times together. It's natural for children to want to unwind and play after school.
