



Dear Morningside families,

I hope that you are all safe and well.

As we approach the half term break I wanted to write to you to say thank you for all of your support during this challenging time.

On Monday and Tuesday I went to class meetings and celebration assemblies in all year groups. I saw over 300 children who were learning at home and around 70 who are learning at school. Our attendance rates for both online and school learning are some of the highest in the borough.

Each and every child was involved in celebrating their classmates. Teachers and support staff explained how tricky choosing the award winners was as there was so much wonderful work. I am very lucky to have access to all of the Google documents and can see both the work and the comments that staff and children leave. I am delighted every day at how supportive and kind our children are to each other as well as with the quality and content of their work. This has been achieved by families and staff working in partnership. So much has changed for us all. The staff have been wonderful in adapting what they do and moving to teaching remotely. Each week they share what is working well and discuss ways to make their offer even better. Their enthusiasm and energy is amazing. The children have had to get used to very different ways of working and their families have had to support this and keep them motivated to learn. I can imagine that this is incredibly hard at times.

Everyone is getting on with doing the best that they can. This week I have seen so many smiles and we need to celebrate our very special school community.

I have only seen and heard negative stories about schools and learning in the press. At Morningside we strive to be positive. Soon we will all be back at school. A major focus of our work moving forwards will be oracy. The children need to find their voices again. They have been doing lots of reading and writing. They need to be with their friends, to socialise, to find their voices (after being "on mute" so many times), to develop their independence, explore their creativity, laugh, talk and have fun. The politicians are missing the point. We don't need a "recovery curriculum" or to worry about "catching up." We will be moving on from where we are now with lots of enthusiasm and positivity. The children have a bright and exciting future ahead of them. I cannot wait to welcome them all back to school.



Safeguarding Children

Information regarding Safeguarding & Child Protection at Morningside Primary School and Children Centre

Our prime responsibility as a school is to ensure that all children are safe.

Safeguarding can be defined as:

"The process of protecting children from abuse or neglect, preventing impairment of their health and development and ensuring they are growing up in circumstances consistent with the provision of safe and effective care that enables children to have optimum life chances and enter adulthood successfully."

School plays an important role here. For Morningside Primary School it means that we have procedures for the following:

- Child Protection
- Behaviour
- E-Safety
- Visits
- Incident Management
- Risk Assessment
- Allegation of Abuse
- Child Absconding
- Information Sharing
- Medical Needs
- Supervision

A copy of our Child Protection policy is available from the school office and the school website.

If you have a concern about a child's welfare, please report it to a member of staff immediately

It is important to avoid any coaching of a child during a disclosure. Any early discussion with the child should, as far as possible, adhere to the following basic principles:

- A. <u>Listen</u> to the child, rather than directly question him or her
- B. <u>Never</u> stop a child who is freely recalling significant events
- C. Make a note of the discussion, taking care to record the timing setting and personnel present as well as what was said

Report any concerns to a member of staff straight away – never delay to inform the relevant officer.
