School Streets

Zone SS14 – Morningside Primary School – Chatham Place and Ram Place


- School Streets is the Council's pioneering scheme to transform roads outside schools, so that only pedestrians and cyclists can use them at school start and finish times.
- The streets tackle congestion and improve air quality at the school gates, making it easier and safer to walk and cycle to school.
- They create a more pleasant environment for everyone, while making sure residents, businesses, pedestrians and cyclists can still use the road.

How it works

The streets around a school temporarily become a pedestrian and cycle only zone at set times in the morning and afternoon. Vehicles are not permitted to enter the zone between these times unless they have been granted an exemption.

inform drivers of the Sians restrictions at the entrance(s) to the closed street(s). Vehicles are not allowed to enter the School Streets zone during the times of **operation**, unless they registered for exemption. an School Streets will be enforced across the borough, and infractions can carry a penalty charge issued by a camera. BBQ Chicken Pizza



STEP 1

Heat oven to 220C/200C fan/gas 7. Tip the flour into a mixer with a dough hook, or a bowl. Add the yeast, salt, oil and 200ml warm water then mix well to a very soft dough. Knead in the food mixer for about 5 mins, but if making this by hand, tip onto a work surface and knead for about 10 mins. The dough is sticky, but try not to add too much extra flour. Leave in the bowl and cover with a tea towel while you halve and slice the peppers and onions. There is no need to prove the dough for a specific time, just let it sit while you make the topping.



For the topping: toss the peppers and onions with the oil and Mixed herbs then roast for 15 mins. Meanwhile mix the barbecue sauce and tomato purée with 5 tbsp water.

STEP 3

Take the dough from the bowl and press into the base and up the sides of an oiled 25x35cm tin, or whatever you have. Don't knead the dough first otherwise it will be too elastic and will keep shrinking back. Spread with two thirds of the barbecue sauce mix then add the remainder to the chicken and toss well to coat it.

STEP 4

Take the roasted pepper mixture from the oven and spread on top of the pizza. Scatter over the tomatoes then evenly spoon on the barbecue chicken. Scatter with the cheese and bake for 15 mins. Serve with a salad or healthy coleslaw.



250g strong bread flour, plain flour is also fine

7g or one packet of instant yeast 1 tsp of salt

1tbsp of oil, any oil is fine!

Topping

3 Tbsp Oil

3 Peppers

1 Onion

1 Tsp Mixed Herbs

2 Tbsp BBQ Sauce

2 Tbsp Tomato Puree

1 Chicken Breast

50g Grated Mozzarella

1 Punnet of cherry tomatoes

Safeguarding Children

Information regarding Safeguarding & Child Protection at Morningside Primary School and Children Centre

Our prime responsibility as a school is to ensure that all children are safe.

Safeguarding can be defined as:

"The process of protecting children from abuse or neglect, preventing impairment of their health and development and ensuring they are growing up in circumstances consistent with the provision of safe and effective care that enables children to have optimum life chances and enter adulthood successfully."

School plays an important role here. For Morningside Primary School it means that we have procedures for the following:

- Child Protection
- Behaviour
- E-Safety
- Visits
- Incident Management
- Risk Assessment
- Allegation of Abuse
- Child Absconding
- Information Sharing
- Medical Needs
- Supervision

It is important to avoid any coaching of a child during a disclosure. Any early discussion with the child should, as far as possible, adhere to the following basic principles:

- A. <u>Listen</u> to the child, rather than directly question him or her
- B. <u>Never</u> stop a child who is freely recalling significant events
- C. Make a note of the discussion, taking care to record the timing setting and personnel present as well as what was said

Report any concerns to a member of staff straight away – never delay to inform the relevant officer.

- 6 Log in.

The app is very easy to use. Just tap on the icons to find your way around, There's a walk-through video and Help Centre at www.marvellousme.com, if you need any help.

Tips for parents








'Activities' tell you what your child is learning, 'Badges' tell you why the teacher has praised your child and 'Messages' keep you up to date. Think of them as conversation starters to everyday questions like: 'What did you learn at school today?' 'Were you good?' "Have you got any messages?'



Use your new insight wisely and prompt conversations with your child at different times, such as when travelling, over dinner or at quiet times together. It's natural for children to want to unwind and play after school.



Show the MarvellousMe app to your child. It will help them to reflect on their learning and feel proud of the teacher's positive comments.
