# What's been happening at Morningside?

In Nursery we have been exploring ice. We used hammers and golf tees, salt and water with pipettes to free the Bears from the ice. We've had lots of discussions about how we can help them.



Also, we have been busy practicing making marks in the sand.



For no pens Wednesday we have been having a go at rolling marbles in paint to colour our roses.





Lastly we have been making our own bears and using different colours. We have been talking about our teddy bears at home and what they look like.

In art, Year 1 have been learning about the artist Henri Matisse. We practised different collaging techniques.





In Year 2 RE we are learning about Hinduism. We found out that they have a celebration called Diwali, which is also known as the Festival of Light. On No Pens Day we made our own lanterns to represent the Festival of Diwali.

Year 5 have launched their life cycles topic by completing flower dissections. We learned all about how plants reproduce and then cut up a lily to see for ourselves all the different parts of a flower.





The pupils in 3S really enjoyed 'No Pens Day.' Year 3 took part in some concrete learning during maths. They had to put the counters into groups to solve the word equations.

Year 6 learnt how light is reflected in Science this afternoon. They concluded that the angle of incidence is always equal to the angle of reflection. The children proved that they could see an object that was behind them when using a light source and a mirror.


### **School Uniform**

### **School Meals**

Information regarding School Meals provided in Morningside Primary School

Morningside has a wide selection of delicious food to cater for all of our children's needs including vegetarian and Halal options

#### **Lunch times**

This year, there are different lunchtimes for each year group in order to facilitate social distancing and thorough cleaning of shared spaces. Children eat their lunch inside and then go outside to play.

#### **Payments**

School lunches are £1.85 per day or £9.25 per week. Payments for school meals need to be made on Parent Pay. Please visit the school office if you require account details, or would like help setting up your account.



#### Universal Infant Free School Meals

The government enables every child in reception, year 1 and year 2 in state-funded schools to receive a free school lunch. For more information on how this works please visit the gov.uk website.

#### Free School Meals

Applying for free school meals can save you hundreds of pounds a year. If you think your child may be entitled to free school meals please complete the form.



#### **Packed Lunches**

It is important for children to be given a healthy packed lunch each day. A balanced meal makes a child alert and ready to aim high with their learning. Please do come and talk to us if you would like some ideas about how to provide healthy meals for your child.

#### Water

Water is available in the dining hall at lunchtimes and in the playground during playtime. We encourage children to drink freely at these times.



### Safeguarding Children

Information regarding Safeguarding & Child Protection at Morningside Primary School and Children Centre

#### Our prime responsibility as a school is to ensure that all children are safe.

Safeguarding can be defined as:

"The process of protecting children from abuse or neglect, preventing impairment of their health and development and ensuring they are growing up in circumstances consistent with the provision of safe and effective care that enables children to have optimum life chances and enter adulthood successfully."

School plays an important role here. For Morningside Primary School it means that we have procedures for the following:

- Child Protection
- Behaviour
- E-Safety
- Visits
- Incident Management
- Risk Assessment
- Allegation of Abuse
- Child Absconding
- Information Sharing
- Medical Needs
- Supervision



It is important to avoid any coaching of a child during a disclosure. Any early discussion with the child should, as far as possible, adhere to the following basic principles:

- A. <u>Listen</u> to the child, rather than directly question him or her
- B. <u>Never</u> stop a child who is freely recalling significant events
- C. Make a note of the discussion, taking care to record the timing setting and personnel present as well as what was said

Report any concerns to a member of staff straight away – never delay to inform the relevant officer.
