Managing children's screen time

Did you know?

The average child, aged 5-12, spends over 2 hours online a day and almost half of children admit they find it difficult to switch their devices off.

What can you do to help?

Limiting screen time has many benefits. It means children who find it difficult to 'switch off' independently are being supported; it leads to better quality sleep and helps with their emotional wellbeing.

School Uniform

All children should come to school dressed in the correct school uniform. When your child has PE they can come dressed in their PE kit which is: **plain white t-shirt, black, navy or grey tracksuit bottoms or black shorts.** No child should come in their football kit.

What's happening in the news this week?





In Year 4, they performed their scenes from their Work Week learning, Showcase, using props. They were all amazing!




We would like to wish Y6 all the very best for their SATs tests next week. We are all really proud of your progress and know you will all try your very best.

Our Learning this week...



Year 4 have been learning about the job of a lighting technician. They worked in groups to create working electrical circuits and learnt how lighting can be manipulated for theatrical effect.



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


